Background - Voluntary Partnership Agreement

- O Negotiations between Guyana and EU commenced in 2012
- O Aims to demonstrate legality of exported wood products
- O Agreement concluded in November 2018
- O Now in pre-implementation phase
 - GTLAS design, develop, implement
 - Secretariat establishment
 - Trial FLEGT-licenses wood products in EU
- O Full implementation could take upwards of **four years**

Rationale for National Forest Management Standard and Forest Management and Chain of Custody Certification System

- O VPA addresses legality, while market focus is increasingly on sustainability
- O Unsustainable and illegal activities impact on livelihoods, revenue generation and ecosystem integrity
- O Procurement policies looking to third party certification
- O Need to look beyond legality

Certification options and why PEFC?

- O Third party certification offered by PEFC and FSC for whole supply chain from forests to retailers
- O Both PEFC and FSC provide internationally accepted endorsement of sustainability, however:
 - PEFC is largest program globally
 - PEFC uses "bottom-up" approach to developing forest management standards
 - PEFC is specifically designed to work with current intergovernmental processes and recognise local conditions
 - VPA
 - ITTO, Tarapoto Process criteria and indicators

The PEFC approach presents an opportunity to develop a globally recognised certification system that is truly reflective of the uniqueness of Guyana's forest management situation and the particular needs and expectations of the Guyanese people

Relationship between VPA and NFM Standard


- O Alignment of standard with PEFC system will provide strong linkages with existing government policies and processes of Guyana
- O A natural extension of current FLEGT and REDD+ initiatives complements the VPA
- O Synergies between VPA and PEFC standard setting will speed process of standard development, so certification system can be up and running before VPA becomes operational and FLEGT licences issued

Project scope - national forest management standard and certification scheme

- O Will cover forest management on all land tenures where forest management for commercial purposes is permitted by law
- O Intended that certification will be available to both individual forest management organisations and potential group schemes involving multiple forest management entities
- O Certification will cover non-timber forest products as well as timber produce
- Scheme will also facilitate chain of custody certification for entities purchasing, processing and/or trading in forest products

Progress to date

- O Project approved by GFC Board in early 2019
- O In November 2019, PEFC General Assembly voted to approve GFC's membership of PEFC
- As Governing Body, GFC will oversee the establishment of a technical working group for development of the standard
- O Work on project suspended in March 2020 due to election and COVID
- Project now re-commenced with PEFC endorsement of online technologies to support standard development

2	 Certification scheme development Stakeholder consultations through national workshops to develop the scope for the national standards and certification scheme Establishment of a broad-based national Technical Working Group (with representatives drawn from the major stakeholder groups) to guide the development of the national standards Development of the national standards including documentation, procedures and policy guidelines for a national certification scheme to meet the requirements of key international certification schemes Field testing of the standards Creation of a national forest management and chain of custody certification system 	Feb - Dec 2021

Phase	Details	Status
3	Implementation of certification scheme at the national level (i.e. prior to PEFC-endorsement)	Target early 2022
4	PEFC Endorsement of the certification scheme	Target end 2022
5	Ongoing implementation of the scheme, including management of ongoing PEFC accreditation	2023 on
